ATTENTION ALL FOREIGN EXHIBITORS

Effective Jan/1992 all dogs that are foreign-born and foreign-owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC (Canadian Kennel Club) events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an ERN - Event Registration Number. This ERN does not register a dog with CKC for breeding purposes as defined in the Animal Pedigree Act but rather enables a foreign-owned dog to be awarded titles by the Canadian Kennel Club. Each dog must have its own number. To obtain an ERN, mail or fax a photocopy of the dog's foreign registration certificate with cheque or VISA/Mastercard number (expiry date, cardholder's name and signature). Provide your complete address for return of the ERN to you. **Cost is \$58.30.** ERN MUST BE APPLIED FOR WITHIN 30 DAYS OF FIRST DAY OF ENTERING A CKC EVENT.

Transition Obedience Classes

Pre-Novice for any purebred dog that has not earned the title PCD (Pre Companion Dog) title in Canada. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class and must have an additional handler for each dog when they are judged together in group exercise. A dog may be entered in this class that has not earned the title of CD in Canada or US. The Pre Novice class is an elective class and earning a title is not a requirement to advance to Novice Classes. The CKC will permit the use of PCD signifying Pre Companion Dog to be used in connection with and after the name of the dog. In order to receive this title dogs must receive passing scores in three different trials under two different judges.

Novice C for any purebred dog of either sex that has earned the title Companion Dog, Companion Dog Excellent, Utility Dog or any other advanced Obedience title in Canada prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. Exhibitors may enter more than one dog in this class but must have a separate handler for each dog in the Long Sit and The Long Down Exercises when they are judged in the same group. The Novice "C" exercises will be performed and judged as described in the official Novice Class except that exhibitors may compete in the Novice "C" Class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs entered in the Novice "C" Class are not eligible for High In Trial. The P.C.D and C.D.I and Novice "C" are elective classes which are offered for those people who feel the dog requires ring experience and acclimation to the trial situation or would like to earn additional titles. Dogs may be entered in the Novice Intermediate (C.D.I) and/or Novice "C" in addition to any one of the Official Classes or Unofficial Classes.

Novice Intermediate for dogs of any recognized or listed breed and of either sex that have earned the title of (C.D.) Companion Dog, Companion Dog Excellent, Utility Dog and any other advanced obedience title in Canada. A dog eligible for entry in the Open A or B Class at any obedience trial held under these rules is also eligible for entry in the Novice C and Novice Intermediate Class at the same trial. The Novice Intermediate class (C.D.I.) is an elective class and earning a title is not a requirement to advance to a Companion Dog Excellent title. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial. Dogs are eligible to compete in this class indefinitely. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

Unofficial Obedience Classes

Graduate Novice for any purebred dog of either sex that has not earned a qualifying score toward the C.D.X. title in Canada, but which has obtained the title of C.D. in Canada prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. Exhibitors may enter more than 1 dog in this class but must have a separate handler for each dog in the Long Sit & Long Down exercises when they are judged in the same group.

Graduate Open for any purebred dog of either sex that has not earned a qualifying score toward the U.D. title in Canada, but which has obtained the title of C.D.X. in Canada prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. Exhibitors may enter more than 1 dog in this class but must have a separate handler for each dog in the Long Sit Exercise when they are judged in the same group.

Veterans Class for any purebred dog that has an obedience title and is 7 years of age or older on the day of the trial. The exercises shall be performed and judged as in the Novice Class. Dogs entered in this Class must also be entered in any Regular class or for Exhibition Only.

Brace Class for any purebred dog that has an obedience title. The exercises shall be performed and judged as in the Novice Class. Dogs entered in this Class must also be entered in any Regular class or for Exhibition Only.

Team Class is open to any 4 dogs of any breed and of either sex which have attained not less than a C.D. title in Canada. It is not necessary that the same person own all the dogs in the team. Five dogs may be entered, one to be considered as an alternate. However, the same 4 dogs must compete in all exercises. Dogs entered in this Class must also be entered in any Regular class or for Exhibition Only.

Versatility Class is open to any dog of either sex that has attained the title of C.D.X. in Canada and at least 1 leg on the Utility title prior to the closing date of the trial. Dogs entered in this Class must also be entered in any Regular class or for Exhibition Only.

The following CKC classes (divided by sex) will be provided:

Canadian Bred	for dogs born in Canada; champions in any country excluded
Bred By Exhibitor	for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder

Veteran (7-10 yrs)	for any dog, 7 years of age, but less than 10 years of age on the day of the show. These dogs do not compete for Winners, but the winner of this class shall go on to compete for Best of Breed. DOGS COMPETING IN THIS CLASS MAY BE SPAYED OR NEUTERED.
Veteran (10+ yrs)	for any dog, 10 years of age or older on the day of the show. These dogs do not compete for Winners, but the winner of this class shall go on to compete for Best of Breed. DOGS COMPETING IN THIS CLASS MAY BE SPAYED OR NEUTERED.
Specials Only	dogs which are <u>registered individually</u> , in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club or have a CKC ERN number and have attained championship status may be entered in the "Specials Only" class. Entry of a dog in "Specials Only" is not prohibited on the grounds that the title of champion has not been confirmed by the CKC, but if it is found later that the dog had not attained championship status before the entry had been made, then all awards attained at the show will be cancelled. The entry of a 'listed' dog in Specials Only is not allowed.

NON-REGULAR & UNOFFICIAL CONFORMATION CLASSES

TO COMPETE IN THE SWEEPSTAKES CLASS, DOGS MUST BE ENTERED IN A REGULAR CLASS, OR FOR SPECIALS ONLY. ENTRY IN JUVENILE SWEEPSTAKES FROM THE EXHIBITION ONLY CLASS IS NOT ALLOWED. VETERANS MAY BE ENTERED IN EXHIBITION ONLY.

Juvenile Sweepstakes Classes will be divided by sex as follows:
(May 14 & May 17)

6 - 9 months
9 - 12 months
12 - 18 months

Veteran Sweepstakes Classes will be divided by sex as follows:
(May 14 & May 17)

7 - 10 years
10 years & older

Breeder Sweepstakes Dogs need not be owned by the breeder, but they must be handled in the ring by the breeder of record.
(May 14 ONLY)

Classes will be divided as follows (**NOT DIVIDED BY SEX**):

Puppy (6-12 months)
Open (1-6 years)
Veteran (7 years and older)

ALL DOGS MUST BE ENTERED IN THE REGULAR CLASSES, VETERAN'S CLASS, "SPECIALS ONLY", OR FOR EXHIBITION ONLY TO COMPETE IN THE FOLLOWING NON-REGULAR CLASSES.

Sire & Get Stud dog and two or more of his get, not necessarily owned by the same owner.

Dam & Progeny Brood bitch and two of more of her progeny, not necessarily owned by the same owner.

Brace Two dogs of one breed (either sex or mixed), **not necessarily owned by the same owner.**

Parade of Title-Holders & Veterans

For any dog that has successfully completed all requirements for a CKC title in any CKC recognized event or is 7 years of age or older.

SEXUALLY ALTERED CLASSES

Eligibility for the Altered Dog Classes shall be limited to dogs over 6 months of age which have been sexually altered by veterinary procedure. Points MAY NOT be carried from the regular competition judging to the Altered Dog Class judging. These classes will be judged immediately after Best of Breed of the regular classes.

Two classes will be offered: Altered Male & Altered Female

Classes will be placed first through fourth in both sexes, the first place winner from each class will be declared Winners and the second place winner will be declared Reserve Winners. The Altered Winners Male and the Altered Winners Female will then compete for Best of Breed Altered and Best of Opposite Sex Altered in Breed.

OBEDIENCE CLASSIFICATIONS

Regular Obedience Classes

Novice A for any purebred dog that has not earned the title of CD. Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. The dog must be handled by the owner or member of his immediate family. No licensed handler, no trainer, nor any person who has previously handled a dog through its UD title in Canada or elsewhere shall be allowed to compete in this class. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is not eligible for entry in this class.

Novice B for any purebred dog that has not earned the title of CD in CANADA. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. More than one dog may be entered by any handler, but each dog must have a separate handler for the 'sit' and 'down' exercise. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is eligible for this class.

Open A for any purebred dog that has earned the title of CD but has not won the title of CDX. Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. The dog must be handled by the owner or a member of his immediate family. No licensed handler, no trainer, nor any person who has previously handled a dog through its UD title in Canada or elsewhere shall be allowed to compete in this class. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is not eligible for entry in this class.

Open B for any purebred dog that has earned the title of CD, CDX or UD in CANADA. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. More than one dog may be entered by any handler, but each dog must have a separate handler for the 'sit' and 'down' exercise. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is eligible for this class. A dog may be entered in both Open A and Open B at any one trial.

Utility for any purebred dog that has earned the title of CDX in CANADA.
